Reservists residing in South Africa—All Reservists of A B and C residing in South Africa will be called up for permanent service by the general officers commanding.

In Cape Colony and Natal the Army Order concludes with the following notice relating to the "mobilization of a Field Force for service in South Africa":—"A Field Force, details of which are issued to all concerned, will be mobilized at once. The 9th of October is the first day of mobilization. The Army Reservists required to complete the Field Force to war establishment will rejoin on or before October 17."

It is stated that the mobilization order will affect between 30,000 and 40,000 men.

PARLIAMENT SUMMONED.

The Queen, at a meeting of the Privy Council at Balmoral to-day, gave her formal assent to the assembling of Parliament on October 17th. The officials at Westminster have already received an intimation that the Lords and Commons will meet on that date.

FURTHER DETACHMENTS LEAVE FOR SOUTH AFRICA.

A special train left Waterloo at noon to-day for Southampton with a number of officers, who sail this afternoon in the Union liner "Mexican" for the Cape. Among the officers is Major Girouard, who takes charge of military railway arrangements in South Africa.

A later telegram says:—The Union liner "Mexican" left Southampton to-day for the Cape. She had on board Lieut.-Col. J. F. Brocklehurst, who is to command the cavalry of the divisional troops in Natal), a detachment of the Army Ordnance Corpe, and a number of Staff and other officers.

CRUISERS TO BE HELD IN READINESS.

It is stated at Portsmouth to-day that certain cruisers are to be held in readiness if required for special service.

PROVOST OF EDINBURGH DECLINES TO CALL A MEETING OF PROTEST.

The Lord Provost of Edinburgh has declined to accede to a memorial for a meeting of citizens to protest against the war with the Transvaal. The memorial was signed by the three Liberal members for Edinburgh. His lordship declines all requests of this nature, which have no political aspect.

BOARD OF TRADE RETURNS.

The Board of Trade returns for September show that the imports for the month amounted to £38,721,079, an increase of £3,163,591 compared with last year. The exports for the month amounted to £22,374,867, an increase of £2,429,722.
