cause the Verdicts of the British and American Chief Justice Chambers has declared to be the lawful king. A combined British and American landing party a few days ago defeated Ma Tafans, inflicting a loss of 27 killed. On April 1st another combined force, under Lieutenant Freeman, of H. M. S. Tauranga, advanced against the enemy, but fell into an ambush and was forced to retire, Lieutenant Freeman and two leading seamen of H. M. S. Royalist being killed and five others wounded. The American officers killed were Lieutenant Lansdale and Ensign John Monaghan, and one of the seamen, Coxswain James Butler, of the cruiser Philadelphia, a native of Dungarvan, County Waterford. Besides the loss in men, two of their light guns were captured by the enemy. The ambush is said to have been laid in a German fortification, the owner of which has been arrested and taken on board the Tauranga. H M gunboat Goldfinch and cruiser Wallaroo have been ordered from Sydney to Samoa, where there are already three British, one American, and three German warships.
