Mr Keane said what he had stated there before was that it appeared to be the opinion of some people that the Association seemed to have been got up against the cottages. He believed they did not care about the Association. If they got a room in the hall they could not hamper the Council in the building of the cottages.

Mr Harwood—It is an effort to bring Conest active influence on the board.

The Chairman then put the motion, when there voted for triennial elections—Messrs McDonald, Abern, Cahill, Harwood, Neylon, Harris and the Chairman—8.
