Mr John Condon, solicitor, appeared for the applicant.  
Mrs B O'Connor, Ballynahill, applied for a transfer from Patrick O'Connor.  
It was granted.  
Mr P T Liston, solicitor, appeared for the applicant.  
His Honor said in the case of Windle, Carrigkenny, the magistrates were equally divided last Sessions, and he took that as being against the applicant. He now read a letter from Mr J. O'G. Delmege, who he said was a man of the highest honor, and the greatest sportman from Abbeyfeale to the Limerick Junction, withdrawing his opposition, Windle being an honest, hard-working man, and it was better he should have it than another.

The Bench unanimously granted the licence—a beer one.  
Mr John Condon, solr, appeared for applicant. Mary Moloney's application for a licence in Abbeyfeale was adjourned to next sessions, on the application of Mr Condon, solicitor.

### MALICIOUS INJURIES.

His Honor said he would notice and hear with the closest attention everything in connection with the serious application from Askeaton. It was very heavy and serious, involving a consideration of £5,000 or £6,000, and everything on both sides would be carefully and intelligently investigated. His conduct in these malicious injury cases was criticised outside, not unfairly, for a great deal could be said on both sides for extending the area to the whole county or confining it. He would not say now whether he would depart from his usual custom, but every opportunity would be given to both sides to put forward their views.

Mr Sheehy said the Newcastle District Council had employed a special solicitor in their interests.

Mr Wm Leahy, solicitor, said he was directed by the County Council, and had already briefed counsel in the case.

Mr P T Liston, solicitor, said he was interested on behalf of a large district, and the universal opinion was that his Honor should not depart from his usual custom, but have the amount placed on the county.

His Honor said he would hear nothing more of the case until it came before him on Monday, and after full investigation he would then decide.

### CRIMINAL BUSINESS.

Nora O'Brien, wife of a tinker, was charged with stabbing her sister-in-law with a pitchfork.

Mr P T Liston, solicitor, appeared for the defence.

Mr Liston said it was all jealousy. The parties were horse dealers, not tinkers as described, and were after returning home from the fair of Ballinasloe. They were all friends, and the little incident was now forgotten.

His Honor asked where was this gallant and gay Lothario that all this row and fighting was about? (laughter).

James O'Brien came forward and stood between his wife and sister-in-law.

Mr Liston pleaded guilty on behalf of his client, and his Honor discharged her from custody.
