#### DEATH OF MR T COONEY

The announcement of the death of this wellknown sportsman will, we are sure, be received by our readers with universal regret. deceased had a very varied career, first as submanager of the gas works, then car proprietor, mail ear contractor, and travelling circus pro-prietor. He was, however, best known as a hunting man, and his exploits in the field and at the jumping competitions will long be remem-bered by old and young on account of the daring acts performed by "Thady." He was a man absolutely devoid of fear, and many of the old country people can relate tales of his doings which the younger generation of "Nimrod" would scarcely credit. His resemblance to a well-known nobleman, too, bas often been commented upon. Many amusing anecdotes are current in connection with this circumstance, and Thady's "jovial spirit delighted in keeping up the illusion. Mr Cooney was not unknown to the world of fashion. He was a frequent and well-known visitor at more than one London mension, where his fine physique, native wit, and jovial nature, enabled him to fully sustain his title of "Master of the Hounds." He was an old and valued Post Office servant, having held the contract for the city and Killsloe mail car service for over a quarter of a century. sourceful energy and skill in the management of horses were of high value in this branch of the public service, and his place will be oue not easy to fill.
