##### RELIEF SPECULATIONS.

A telegram to the London Express from Cape  
 Town, dated Monday, says—The latest news  
 received here as to Mafeking points to the pro-  
 bability that the garrison was actually relieved  
 yesterday. The force under General Hunter is  
 believed to have started for Mafeking, while  
 General Barton was engaging the Boers at Ruy-  
 dan on May 5. It was hoped and reckoned that  
 Hunter would reach Mafeking yesterday or that,  
 allowing for a few days' delay through opposition,  
 he would certainly get there to-day. News only  
 comes by wire via Colonel Plumer and Bulayo,  
 and takes two days on the way. The glad tidings
