STATISTICS OF FAILURES.

According to *Kemp's Mercantile Gazette*, the number of Failures recorded in Ireland during the week ending September 13th, was 7, viz.:—
1. Bankruptcy Proceedings published in the *Gazette*, 1; Deeds of Arrangement filed at the Office of Sale Office, 6. The respective numbers in the corresponding week of last year were: Bankruptcies, 2; Deeds of Arrangement, 6; being a net increase in Bankruptcies of 5 and a net decrease in Deeds of Arrangement in the week, of 49.
2. Number of Bills of Sale published in Ireland during the same week was 3. The number in the corresponding week of last year was 4, showing a decrease of 1, being a net decrease in 1901, to 3.
3. Number of Bonds and Judgments published during the same week was 34, of which 19 were against Traders, and 15 against Farmers and non-Traders. The numbers in the corresponding week of last year were 5 against Traders, and 16 against Farmers and non-Traders, showing an increase of 29 against Traders and a decrease of 1 against Farmers and non-Traders, being a net increase in the week, of 161.

DEBENTURES.

Mortgages and Charges registered by Companies in Ireland during the week ending September 13th, amounted to £1,000, by addition to £88,130 previously issued by the same companies. The total amount registered to the same date was £89,130, in addition to the issues in previous years by the same companies.
