

# FUNERAL OF THE LATE MR. FREDERICK T. FINCH.

The funeral of the late Mr. Frederick T. Finch, whose unexpected death on Monday last caused feelings of widespread regret, took place this morning, the remains being removed from his late residence, the Crescent, at nine o'clock for interment at St. Mary's Cathedral. The large and representative attendance testified to the high esteem in which the deceased gentleman was held by all classes. Although the announcement had been made that the funeral would be private, a large concourse of the citizens assembled to pay the last mark of respect to the deceased gentleman.

The remains were enclosed in a mahogany shell, with an outer coffin of polished oak, bearing the inscription:

FREDERICK T. FINCH.  
Died November 10th, 1902,  
Aged 65 years.
