

... court sitting at Newcastle West, which sentenced him to concurrent sentences of three months imprisonment on three charges of unlawful assembly, intimidation, and conspiring to intimidate.

... the hearing of the case and the examination of witnesses occupied the whole of the afternoon, proceedings being very protracted.

... His Honor, after a long judgment (which shall give in our next) affirmed the sentence of three months imprisonment on Mr. Harris, but ordered that he should be treated as a first class misdemeanant.

... He also affirmed the rule of bail, and pointed out that if Mr. Harris chose to remain in prison for a further term of three months instead of giving bail, it would be his own voluntary act.

... In the case of Sheehan the sentence was affirmed, but His Honor directed that he should be imprisoned without hard labour.

... His Honor also said that the defendants would be arrested for a few days to come.
