DEATH OF A WELL-KNOWN CRICKETER.—John Briggs, the Lancashire cricketer, died in Cheadle Asylum at noon to-day.

RAILWAY COLLISION.

A railway collision occurred at Pendleton station near Manchester, on the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway, this morning. A passenger train ran into the rear of a goods train which was standing in a loop and not clear of the main line. The van of the goods train was knocked over. Four passengers are known to have been injured. None killed.

The left-hand side of the passenger train was damaged all along its length. Several passengers complained of serious injuries, and some were taken to Salford Royal Hospital. Traffic was considerably delayed. The permanent way was much damaged.
