

The tenants on the above estate, which is situated at Cappa and Kiltannon, have willingly accepted the offer of the landlord, Mr. Wm. King, Phibsboro' Road, Dublin, to sell at 25 years' purchase, and 35 per cent. off present rents. The Rev. T. Curtin conducted the negotiations for the tenants.

DECLINED TO PAY.

Mr. Turner, agent on the Burton estate, met the tenants at Kilrush on Friday. The tenants made a demand to purchase their holdings at 20 per cent. reduction, or four shillings in the pound on first term rents. He declined absolutely to entertain the question of sale or to give any concession or abatement in view of the bad harvest on the rents now falling due, and which he was on tour to collect. The tenants declined to pay any rents in view of the attitude of Mr. Turner, and arranged to defend all tenants processed.

The Rev. Canon French, M.R.I.A., Rector of Clonegal, has agreed to sell his property to his tenants. The terms agreed upon are 22 years' purchase on the present rents; the tenants are allowed the current half year's rent and all arrears—a goodly sum—are forgiven. The sporting rights are given to the tenants.
