PREVENTION OF CRUELTY TO CHILDREN SOCIETY.

At a meeting of the Society for the Prevention
of Cruelty to Children held at the Chamber of
Commerce this afternoon, the Countess of Dun-
raven presiding. A discussion took place as to
the best means of putting the Society into
operation in Limerick, and with regard to
the appointment and salary of Inspec-
ter. A number of subscriptions and
assurances of support were received. An
Executive Committee was appointed, to which
the matter of working the Society was referred,
and the hon. secretary, Miss Duan, was instructed
to communicate with Clare and Tipperary, to ask
their co-operation with the County Limerick, and
report to the General Committee.
