**COMPULSORY EDUCATION.**

At a meeting of the City Compulsory Education Committee held yesterday, a letter was submitted from the Commissioners of Education bearing upon the formation of the School Attendance Committee. The Town Clerk was directed to reply stating that the Corporation desired to appoint five of their own members as one half, and to request the Commissioners to favourably consider the appointment of clerical gentlemen from both sides to constitute the other half.
