Numbers in Market—Beasts, 3,979; decrease, 624. Sheep, 5,367; decrease, 863. Calves, 25; decrease, 5.

For a Christmas export market the show of prime beef was not up to the average of previous years. Butchers' trade, however, except for choice qualities, which were bought up early at about last week's usual quotations. Rough and inferior descriptions were common to all, and prices were very uneven, and generally lower. Stale odds which were not in demand, being sold freely at about top quotation. All classes in able sheep realised late rates, conditions favouring sellers.
