For a Christmas export market the show of prime beef was much below the average of previous years. Demand was low except for choice qualities which were bought up early at about last week's quotations. Rough and inferior descriptions were sold at very low prices and were very heavy. A few choice stallions which were not marketed by large sellers at about top quotations. All classes of able sheep realised late rates, conditions favouring sellers.
