## DEATH OF MR J. J. CASEY, ASKEATON.

We regret to announce the death of Mr. John  
 J. Casey, Askeaton, which occurred on Tuesday  
 at the residence of his brother-in-law, Mr. John  
 Fitzgibbon, D.C., after a lengthy illness. The  
 deceased gentleman had only just completed his  
 forty-eight birthday, and was a member of years  
 an official of the National Board in Dublin. He  
 was brother of the late Mr. Walker Casey, Rath-  
 keale, and like that gentleman enjoyed a wide  
 share of popularity. The interment took place at  
 Askeaton.

## FATAL ACCIDENT.

A fatal accident occurred at Waterford Railway  
 Station on Monday evening. A shunter named  
 Richard Power, aged 55 years, was engaged  
 in shunting operations in the goods yard,  
 when a horse which was drawing the waggon  
 shied and reared on his hind legs, and  
 crushing the deceased, who was immediately  
 behind him. The deceased was attended by a  
 clergyman but died before the arrival of Drs.  
 Mackeray and Morris, having lived only twenty  
 minutes. An inquest was held last evening by  
 Dr. Mackeray and Alderman Ward, J.P., when  
 the jury found a verdict of accidental death, and  
 recommended the family of the deceased to the  
 consideration of the Railway Company.
