TWO FATALITIES IN COUNTY LIMERICK. FROM DAY TO

It is reported that two fatalities have occurred near Pallas and Doon, County Limerick, about nine miles from Tipperary, during the last few days. On Tuesday last a farmer named Maurice Power, aged 30, residing at Gurthavalla, near Doon, was drawing hay to a rick for Wm. Grady, publican, Doon, and when returning at nightfall one of the wheels of his car ran up on the ditch, causing the car to overturn, catching the unfortunate man underneath and crushing in his chest. His brother or some of the neighbours coming on afterwards, found the horse knocked down, and released him and brought him to a place of safety. On coming back to right the car they were astonished to find Power underneath quite dead. His funeral took place on Thursday. About the time it was in progress a man named Cornelius Ryan, aged 75, residing near Old Pallas, was engaged not far away in cutting down a tree, which fell and broke his skull, killing him instantly.
