### INTERESTING FISHERY CASE.

To-day, at the County Petty Sessions, a case which has been already three times before Court, and the circumstances of which are familiar to the public, was called. It was at the suit of General A. H. and Mr. E. Taylor, against Messrs. Denis, Philip, and Patrick Coffey, Pat Madden, J. Close, and A. E. Enright, who were summoned for alleged trespass on complainant's fishery at Shrooveke on the 21st February. Messrs. Hickson, O'Donnell, and Hosford declined to adjudicate, and the matter now came before the Hon. J. French, R.M., and Mr. John R. Mr. Charles O'Donnell, solicitor, on behalf of the defendants, applied for a postponement of the case for a fortnight. Mr. Kenny, their solicitor, was at present in Dublin. Mr. Blood-Smyth, solicitor, opposed the application, remarking that this was the fourth time that he was in connection with it. The Court decided to adjourn the case till next court day.
