POISON WINDS.

The simoom, or "poison wind," of the Arabian deserts resembles in all essential points a cyclone. Here, as in a cyclone, is dead calm; and the vacuum created kills by suffocation, the only chance of preserving life being to lie prone on the face on the sand and try to inhale what little breathable air still exists in the upper ground stratum.
