MEDICAL REFORM.

At a second lecture delivered in the henaum this afternoon by Surgeon General Evatt, letters of sympathy were received from Right Rev. Dr. O'Donohue and the Most Rev. Dr. O'Dwyer. The latter wrote that in his own experience of many years as priest on the mission, during which in both town and country districts was brought into contact with the work of dispensary doctors, he had no hesitation in expressing the opinion that having regard to the long years which they had to give before attaining their medical degree, the heavy outlay which this involves, and the importance of the society of the duties which they have to perform, their salaries are utterly insufficient. It often forces good men down to a style of living that is unworthy of their honourable profession. The difficulty is to find additional funds for them—Boards of Guardians will not and not altogether unreasonably, the oppressive weight of existing rates. Yet, I think, in this instance a little liberality may prove to be true economy. But the great obstacle to reform in this, and many other local matters is the provision in the Local Government Board Act of 1902, which stereotyped the Treasury contributions at the amount given in the standard years, no matter what might be the condition and needs of the public service. This seems a most unfair enactment, and I fear that as long as it remains it will not be easy to grant dispensary doctors the full redress to which they are entitled (applause). The lecturer, who was introduced by the Mayor, was accorded a warm vote of thanks at the conclusion of his able lecture.
