A WATCH FROM AFAR

A few days ago Mr. John Curtin, of Caherlevoy, County Limerick, was the recipient through Mr. Dan. Leahy, solicitor, Abbeyfeale, of a rather tragic memento of his brother's death. His brother, Michael, and his wife were some time ago burned to death at Glenamaggey, Australia, in a bush fire which enveloped their homestead, and completely cutting off all chance of escape, burned them to death and most of their property. Assets of the deceased, amounting to over £1,000 were distributed between John and his sister, and the memento referred to, a watch of the deceased brother, which was blackened and discoloured from the fire, was handed to Mr Curtin by Mr. Leahy.
