The five events that the day contained brought out respectable entries, and in a few instances the finishes were particularly in the Shannon Plate, secured by the artist, from Exult, with Period a good second. The Executive, as usual, discharged its duties with tact and ability, leaving nothing to be desired. The Spring Plate was won by Alma, the Greenpark Plate by Roseville, the Cork Plate by Alannah, and the Provincial by Onward.
