# LAMENTABLE FATALITY AT BALLYBUNION.

Plucky Rescue.

On Thursday evening Dr. Clancy, J.P., Listowel District Coroner, held an inquest touching the death of the Rev. J. Conway, C.C., Shanagolden, Co. Limerick, aged 48 years, whose body hat been taken out of the sea at Ballybunion some hours From the evidence, it appeared that previously. the rev. gencleman went bathing with another clergyman, who was unable to render him any assistance owing to the heavy sea, and only got ashore with consider ble deficulty. The Rev. Mr. Fry, Rector, with characteristic pluck, swam to the assistance of the drowning clergyman, and brought him ashere, but it appeared that life was then extinct, as the most vigorous efforts at artifical respiration failed to restore conciousness. In accordance with the evidence of Dr. Costelloe a verdict of death from drowning was retim ned.
