TWO REMARKABLE EPITAPHS.

MISSING MAN FOUND DEAD.

While a shooting party was going through the woods near Lowestoft on Saturday afternoon one of the beaters discovered in a dry ditch the decomposed body of a man. Beside it lay a rusty revolver, two chambers of which had been discharged. The body was subsequently identified as that of Alexander Patrick, a fishbuyer of Anstruther, Scotland. He had been missing since October 11th from Lowestoft, where he had been engaged in the herring trade.
