DESTRUCTION OF A SLUICE.

This afternoon, the Lord Chief Justice heard an appeal in which the Marquis of Lansdowne claimed £50 damages for the malicious destruction of a sluice at Clonmacken by stones, which were alleged to have been placed under it. The action had been dismissed at Quarter Sessions, and his Lordship now gave a decree for £35, to be levied off the county at large.

The Carnarvon Harbour Trust has resolved to sacrifice a portion of its income by prohibiting the landing of passengers from excursion steamers at Carnarvon on Sunday.
