THE LATE MR. JOHN MOLONEY.

Much regret is felt at the death of Mr. John Moloney, Manager, Croom Mills, which took place at the Cottage, Croom, on Sunday morning, after a very brief illness. The deceased, who was 55 years of age, was in good health up to Christmas, but having contracted a cold, pneumonia set in. The deceased spent all his years in the Croom Mill, first as clerk in his boyhood, and as manager for almost half a century. He became owner within the past 20 years of close upon 1,000 acres of land, all of which he farmed himself, and upon some of which he employed a number of farm hands, while most of his farms were stocked with cattle and sheep. Through his management, the Croom Mill, Croom, and the Croom Mills Bakery, Limerick, have been kept successfully working through storm and sunshine, and a fairly large number of hands are employed at both. The deceased was a Conservative in politics, and a generous donor to those who required his assistance from time to time. The deceased, who was unmarried, has left a huge fortune, and it is reported left no will. His funeral on Tuesday was largely attended by the people of Croom and surrounding districts. The officiating clergymen were Rev. Father Lee, P.P., Croom; Father Devane, C.C., do.; and Frost, P.P., Banogue.
