At the close of the lecture, which was fre-
quently applauded, Father Lee, C.C., St.
Michael's, proposed a hearty vote of thanks to
Mr. Horgan, who, he remarked, was no stranger
amongst them as a lecturer.

Mr. P. O'Brien, in seconding the vote remarked
that Mr. Horgan's book, "Great Catholic Lay-
men," had been dedicated to the President, Very
Rev. Dr. O'Riordan, and the Catholic Institute
of Limerick.

The Mayor, who presided, put the vote of
thanks, which was passed with acclamation, and
Mr. Hogan in reply referred to the sympathy
and inspiration he had received from Dr.
O'Riordan and the Institute in the writing of
the book, a copy of which he now presented
to the Institution.

Mr. H. J. Guinane was moved to the second
chair on the motion of Mr. M. O'Callaghan,
seconded by Mr. P. Hannon, and a vote of thanks
to the Mayor concluded the proceedings.

taken to-morrow evening at 8 o'clock.

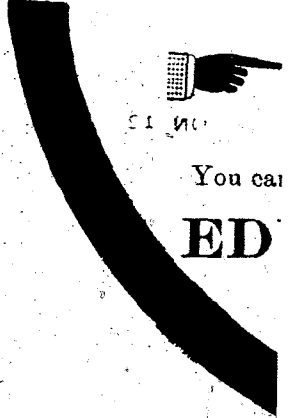
DEATH OF MR. JAMES ROBINSON.
