At a meeting of the Glin District Council, Mr. Donnell (chairman) presiding, a report was from Mr. F. C. Hartigan, Engineer, in connection with the completion of the last scheme of cottages promoted by the Council. The report having been considered, the following resolution was unanimously adopted, on the proposition of Mr. Culhane, seconded by Mr. Donnell:—"That we receive the report of our Engineer, Mr. F. C. Hartigan, B. E., on the completion of the present scheme, we desire to place on record our appreciation of his attention, ability, and services in safeguarding our interests, and the economy of his professional fees, and the manner in which he always met this Council, and we are of opinion that the cottages erected under his supervision in this rural district bear ample testimony to his exceptional skill and experience as an Engineer."

Knocklong Equity Suit

At the Quarter Sessions, before His Honor Mr. Justice Adams,

Wick, administered, for the purpose of paying the debts in the suit, Julia and Deborah Fitzgerald, his daughters, a sum of £100 each, as provided in a will dated 4th March, 1890. His Honor pointed out that probate of the will was granted to the defendant, Michael Toomey, Ellis, of the deceased, and his son, Denis Toomey, now in possession of the lands at Knocklong.
