Five Lives Lost-Recovering the Bodies. A boating disaster, almost without parallel in

the history of modern Limerick, occurred on the Shannon on Sunday evening. At half past twelve a party of six young ment-pleasure bent-went for a row in a gondola as far as Tervoe, which was reached at 2 oplock. After
