

Much regret is expressed at the death of a popular Nenagh guardian, Mr. Stephen Seymour, whose funeral was very largely attended at Castletown.

Deep regret is felt at the death of Colonel F. J. S. Lecky, commanding the Tipperary R.G.A. (M.), who died at Osborne, Isle of Wight, of pneumonia.

Oyster fishing in the Lower Shannon is now in progress, and it is to be hoped will show better results than in late years, which were anything but remunerative, owing to the overdrudging of the bed.

With Mr. Wm. H. Hlop, as manager (late secretary to the Killaloe Slate Company), a new private company has been formed to develop the slate industry in and around Killaloe and Nenagh.

At the last Borrisokane pig fair there were little more than a score of pigs on market. A large number of buyers in attendance. Prices were small.

At a special court held at Tipperary, a young man named Joseph McCormack, from Limerick, was returned for trial to Colonel Quarter Sessions, charged with having in July last obtained food and lodging in Tipperary by falsely representing that he was surveying farms in the locality for the Land Commissioners.

Mr. O'Connor reported to the Ennis Urban Council, at its quarterly meeting this week, that the streets, laneways, alleys, roads, and sidewalks within the municipal boundary were in considerably good order.

There has been a tailors' strike at Nenagh, and Timothy McDonnell, who went on a burst against "blacklegs" has had to pay 5s for his escapade.

At the fair of Glin there were but very few cattle, for which there was no demand. There was a good supply of bonhams for which there was fair demand, at from 20s. to 30s. each.

Rose O'Leary, an inmate of the Nenagh Workhouse, possesses a bad character. She persists in being on the streets after 11 o'clock at night, and when remonstrated with by the Nenagh magistrate, impudently retorted: "Why can't I walk on the streets like anyone else?" Unless she pays 40s and costs she isn't likely to walk on the streets again for some days. She will be in gaol.

The death of Mr. Charles Brococo, which occurred lately in England, and Mr. Joseph Coppe, in America, have caused much sympathy in the Ballinacorney district.

Young lads at Nenagh are too fond of stoning the Town Hall and injuring the shrubs. Twelve of them did this, but only one was caught. He decided to give his companions' names to Mr. Reynolds, the caretaker, and the whole batch will come before the Nenagh magistrates next Saturday.

Two pupils of the Christian Brothers' Schools, Master Conlin, and Master J. McDonnell, have taken scholarships, value £5 each, under the examination scheme of the Clare Joint Committee of Technical Education.

The retaining allowance received by militia men in Kilrush this week has led to the usual scenes of dissipation. The police had an active time in keeping order amongst the intoxicated men, and numerous arrests were made. The calendar at the Petty Sessions Court next day will consequently be pretty heavy.

The residents of the suburb of Cappagh are agitating for a water supply, and have moved the Local Government Board to oblige the Urban Council to meet their demand. The local authority have agreed to deal with the matter forthwith by erecting a second pump.

Interest in the proper upkeep of Kilrush and Shannakyle Cemeteries is lately taking a strong line, and the custodians of both graveyards are now being moved to remedy objects in the way of cleansing from weeds, and bad pathways.

There was great uproar and shouts of "You and the officers are the greatest sinners." A motion was passed declining to pay Mr. Wardle's expenses.

Hong Kong, Thursday.—The emigrant ship Charterhouse, on a voyage between Hochoo and Hong Kong, foundered off Hainan Head on September 30th. Captain Clifton and sixty passengers were lost. A raft, on which were Chief Engineer Dowse, 23 of the crew and two women, was picked up after they had drifted for 43 hours.

St. Petersburg, Wednesday.—Another bomb factory was discovered at a private house to-day. Five persons were arrested.

Richmond, Virginia, Thursday.—An explosion occurred yesterday in the west mine of the Pocahontas Colliery Company at Pocahontas, Virginia, and a large number of men were entombed. One report states that over sixty men are still in jeopardy.

Permission to prospect on Diamond Island has been definitely refused by the Cape Government to the Xema expedition.

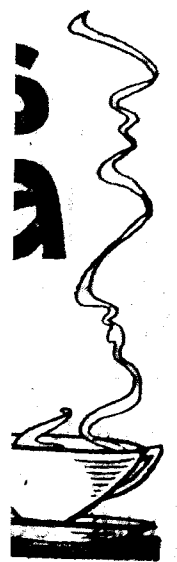
