DROWNED IN THE RIVER.

MYSTERIOUS OCCURRENCE.

Yesterday, shortly before noon, word was brought to the Constabulary at the Dock Road Station that the coat and vest of a man had been found at the river side of the steam boat quay. Bergeunt Beckett, in charge of the police, at once took measures to ascertain if a tatality had occurred. The river was searched, and after some two hours the body of a young man, James Fitzgerald, of Reaves' Path was recovered. The deceased, who is stated to have been a mechanical engineer, breakfasted at half-past eight, and subsequently went out. His relatives, with whom he resided, after he left, did not hear anything further of him until his remains were brought home about two o'clock. The police, up to last evening, were unable to find anyone who could explain how deceased got into the river, as no one appears to have been by at the time of the sad event. The city Coroner, Mr. M.J. DeCourcey, was communicated with by the authorities.

THE INQUEST.

At the inquest to-day, before Mr. Coroner DeCourcy, Sergeant Beckett detailed the finding of the body, and Miss O'Cullaghan, a sister, said deceased went out after breakf st, and she did not see him again. She did not know if he had teen at work, or why he did not go, but Sergeant Bookets said the deceased was late, did not arrive tili 9, and was locked out for the day, as there was no half or quarter time. The sister said the time last week was 9 o'clock, and the Coroner thought an explanation should be given why de-ceased got no notice of the change. Dr. Shanahan said the body bore no marks, and death was from drowning. The jury returned a verdict of found drowning. drowned, and expre-sed their condolences with the fumily.
