SIR ANTHONY'S BILL.

NATIONALISTS "SATISFIED"

The London correspondent of the "News-
letter" wires:--

From inquiries I have made since Sir Antony
McDonnell's now famous speech, I am in a
position to state that Sir Henry Campbell-
Bannerman has satisfied the Nationalist party
that prominence will be given next session to a
measure conferring "self-government" on Ire-
land. The general character of the proposed
legislation will be settled in the late weeks of
September and the early weeks of October,
when Ministers have returned from their holi-
days.

Much to the consternation of certain members
of the Cabinet, the granting of self-government
to the Boers has been used as a powerful argu-
ment by Mr. John Redmond in favour of a
measure which will amount to Home Rule, only
slightly disguised.

DROWNING FATALITY IN THE CITY.

The body of a man who has been identified as
John Fleming, aged 27, Clare street, was recovered
from the river at the back of the Custom House
to-day. The deceased left his own house at eight
o'clock or thereabouts this morning, and an hour
later visited Treaty View Park. Nothing further
was heard of him until the park caretaker, John
McInerney found his clothes on a seat close to
one of the walks. He apprised the police of the
matter and enquiry disclosed that they were
Fleming's. A search was then made for the mis-
sing man whose remains were picked up close
to where he is supposed to have gone to bathe.
The deceased who was unmarried followed the
trade of cooper, and worked at Messrs Spaight
and Sons.

An inquest was held this afternoon by Mr
Coroner DeCourcey and a verdict of "found
drowned" was returned.
