## A DUBLIN SENSATION.

### PROPOSED MURDER AND SUICIDE.

(BY TELEGRAPH TO-DAY.)

About nine o'clock this morning the dead bodies of two persons named Geoghagan, and his wife, were found in their shop in Richmond Street, Dublin, which was a shop of old curiosity shop. A revolver was found beside the bodies, and it is thought that this is one of murder and suicide.

## THE GRANTHAM RAILWAY SMASH.

### CORONER'S INQUIRY.

(BY TELEGRAPH TO-DAY.)

The coroner's inquiry into Grantham Railway disaster was resumed to-day. The Superintendent of the Doncaster Staff gave Driver Wood an excellent character both as to skill and sobriety of habits, but said he had suffered from illness this year. Witness described Talbot, the driver, as a highly competent and experienced man, and if he had not been so drivers would not have complained about him. A engine driver who knew Talbot expressed the opinion that he would be competent to stop a train with ease in an emergency. Other evidence showed that Driver Wood had been away ill for three periods last year, and recently resumed duty. It transpired that in June last the driver was ill on his engine, and returned home from London as a passenger. Other testimony showed that when the train left Peterboro everything went in proper order, and that when it passed the signal box, a quarter of a mile south of Grantham, the driver and fireman were in their usual positions on the engine. The train was going fast to stop at the station, but the signalman did nothing.
