DOCTORS' SALARIES

AT LIMERICK UNION.

At Limerick Board of Guardians yesterday
Mr. John McInerney (chairman) presiding,
Alderman Donnellan moved, in accordance
with notice of motion, "That the resolution
authorising payment of increased salary to the
doctors be rescinded, as the same has not been
legally passed by the Finance Committee." He
said if the Local Government Board paid their
fair proportion of the £1,100, the amount of the
increases, the Guardians would be unanimous in
granting it; but the county could not afford to
pay it. That would mean that the Union
expenditure would go up to £31,000 next year,
or a sum of 3s. 6d. in the £ later on.
