IGNITING CIGAR.  
 igniting cigar has the pointed end of a  
 inserted into its outer end. The match  
 ends slightly beyond a paraffin coating  
 to the end of the cigar. A narrow band  
 is added, for the purpose of protecting  
 r end from damage when striking the  
 This wrapper projects beyond the end,  
 rms a flange and receptacle to  
 the tip of paraffin. To light  
 gar, the match head is struck  
 one rough surface until it ignites.  
 rts the paraffin, which in burning ignites  
 of the cigar. The burning outlasts the
