GOVERNMENT CAN'T ACT

Writing to Mr. Sloan, Mr. Bryce says, over correspondence which may have taken place between Sir Antony McDonnell and any members of the late Government, the present Government have no control. Sir Antony has no personal objection to the publication of the correspondence referred to, but he sees no reason why he should take the initiative in publishing it, and thinks if his own letters are published all the others relating to the matter should be published likewise.
