The Mayor asked Mr. O'Donnell why there was  
such a large sum out-standing, and also such a

outstanding was £13,690.

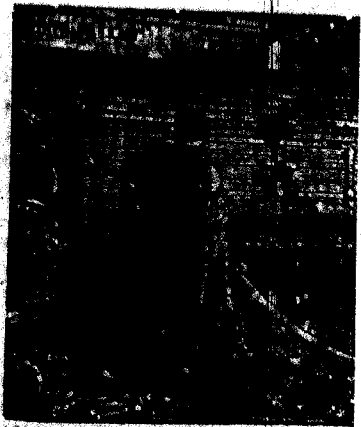
