**LIMERICK LIBEL CASE.**

Yesterday the Court of King's Bench refused to  
 change the venue of a libel action from the city  
 of Limerick to the city of Dublin, the application  
 being made on the ground that the plaintiff was  
 so well-known in the city that defendant's might  
 not get a fair trial. The contestants are the Rev.  
 Fr. Donor, Parish Priest of St. Mary's, formerly  
 President of St. Munchin's College, and the  
 "United Irishman Publishing Co." The alleged  
 libel was contained in comments against Father  
 Donor's disinclination to see a Gaelic League Feis  
 held on Sunday. Mr. P. Kelly (instructed by  
 Mr. F. Avell) appeared to make the application  
 for defendants, and Mr. Charles Doyle, K.C.  
 (instructed by Mr. J. A. Doyle, Limerick) op-  
 posed, Mr. Doyle also refusing a suggestion that  
 the venue should be changed to Cork. Father  
 Donor in his affidavit stated he did not know or  
 enquire what jurors will try the case.
