DEATH OF MRS. MAUNSELL. BALLINGARRY.

We regret to announce the premature demise
of Mrs. C. Maunsell, wife of Sergeant Maunsell,
R.I.C., Ballingarry, which took place in that
town on Sunday morning last. The deceased
had been in failing health for some few months
back, but still there were hopes that she would
in time become convalescent. She was only in
her 29th year, and deep regret is felt at the
passing away of so young a life,—of one who by
her genial and winsome manner endeared her-
self to a wide circle of friends in this city, where
most of her life had been spent, and who, too,
since her sojourn in the country had the best
wishes of all who knew her. Deep sympathy is
expressed with her husband, his little children,
and her respected mother in their great sorrow.
The funeral left Ballingarry this morning for
Castleconnell, where the interment took place.
There was a large attendance, including res-idents
from Ballingarry district and a considerable num-
ber of the R.I.C. from city and county.
