Again they were aware that large numbers of spring salmon in the pink of con-dition enter the Shannon in the month of January, when salmon were very valuable and wanted in the English markets. Yet the fishermen could not now fish for them. connection with cels it was equally desirable that changes in the measons should be made.

After some discussion, in which elerence was made by Mr. Mackay and Mr. McIneracy, to the great loss to the fisheries by the destruction

of spawning fish, the letter was adopted.

Copies were ordered to be sent to the Dapartment of Agriculture, the Fishmongers Association, Lendon, and others.
