LAND ACT LOANS.

45 MILLIONS APPLIED FOR.
 The Chief Secretary, in a written answer to Mr. Lonsdale issued on Saturday, stated that the total amount of advances applied for under the Land Act of 1902 up to the 20th inst. was in round numbers £45,000,000. The amount which had been sanctioned and advanced was £14,292,284. The amount immediately available for further advances was approximately £2,908,000. It was anticipated that this amount would be sufficient to meet advances up to the end of the present year.

PROTEST FROM CROOM.

The members of the Croom Board of Guardians have passed a resolution protesting against the withdrawal of the fees for Irish, and demanding a scale of fees affording adequate encouragement for its teaching, as it is not otherwise provided for out of the public funds.
