**USEFUL LITTLE INSTRUMENT.**

"Association des Industriels de France"  
 awarded to a Chicago Company a prize of  
 and honourable mention for a device  
 as the "Electroscope," which should  
 be valuable to linesmen and all workmen  
 in business it is to handle "live" wire or  
 conductors likely to be carrying high ten-  
 tent. The Electroscope, says the *Magazine*  
*Commerce*, is a simple instrument. It  
 consists of a plain glass tube, mounted on a  
 stand and carrying inside of it a silver indi-  
 cator leaf connected with its hermetically-  
 sealed metal cap. When this cap is presented to  
 the "live" conductor from which the current  
 is cut off the leaf lies flat in the tube.  
 If the conductor contains a dangerous poten-  
 tial the silver leaf will at once stand up. The  
 amount of a potential of an unknown current  
 is approximately judged by the distance  
 at which the leaf will indicate danger,  
 and its action may be studied at any time on  
 a current. A blown fuse may be discovered  
 by holding it on each side of a primary fuse-box.  
 The instrument is made in two sizes—the pocket  
 size in a light aluminium case, and the station-  
 size in a strong wooden one for use in the tool-
