INTERESTING LICENSING POINT

The King's Bench, consisting of the Lord Chief
Baron, Mr. Justice Johnson, and Mr. Justice
Kenny, yesterday declined to decide the question
as to whether or not there was an automatic
forfeiture of a license after the second con-
viction.

The question arose on an application by the
Crown to make absolute two conditional orders—
one to quash a certificate of renewal of a licence
granted by the Justices of Limerick to Mrs.
McCarthy, and the other to quash a decision of the
County Court Judge of Limerick dismissing a sum-
mons that had been brought against Mrs. McCarthy
by which she was charged with having sold drink
on her premises without a licence.

Counsel for the publican contended that there
was no such thing as automatic forfeiture under
the 3rd section of the Act of 1872.

The Judges held that there were two valid
convictions in the present case for two separate
offences. The latter conviction did not show, on
the face of it, that the charge in the summons
and conviction itself was for a second offence.
Without considering the second point, they held
that there had been no forfeiture of the license.

Mr. Dunley White (instructed by the Chief
Crown Solicitor) appeared in support of the
application, and Mr. Phelps (instructed by Messrs.
Conno'ly and Co.) represented the defendants.

A YOUNG LIFE ENDED.

We regret to announce the death of Mr
Michael H. Ryan, of Ballybrack, Clonlara, which
took place on Friday at St John's Hospital, at
the early age of 28 years. Mr. Ryan was a
prominent member of the Gaelic Association, and
his loss is deeply deplored by his many friends in
East Clare. His prowess as a wielder of the
cman was fully recognised, and on many a well
fought field, especially in the inter-county and
county matches, he upheld manfully the honours
of the Banner County. He was a student of the
Queen's College, Galway, where he was studying
engineering. Deceased was a member of an old

deepest sympathy is felt in their sad bereavement.
His interment took place on Sunday last, and the
funeral was one of the largest that left Limerick

SANITARY STATE OF BALLINA- CURRA.

TO THE EDITOR OF THE LIMERICK CHRONICLE.

Limerick, 17th January, 1906.
DEAR SIR—Several months ago your paper
published a letter drawing attention to the
lamentable state of overflow of sewage on the
footpaths in Ballinacurra. Since then nothing
whatever has been done to rectify the evil, and
I suppose nothing will be done until an epidemic
breaks out and several lives jeopardised, if not
lost, by the neglect of the parties responsible.
Within the past ten years, I dare say, several
thousands of pounds must have accrued for the
rates in this district, and yet the inhabitants are
left derelict. Bad sewage, no light at night,
and pathways which are a disgrace and a peril
to be compelled to use. Last Sunday several
people in pursuit of a healthy walk were com-
pelled to turn back by the terrible stench en-
countered en route, and I am certain that many
who use this place for their "constitutional"
will say that I have not over-stated the case in
any way.
