WINTER SESSION

RE-ASSEMBLING OF PARLIAMENT.

BY TELEGRAPH TO-DAY.
Parliament re-assembled this afternoon for the autumn session, the Commons meeting at quarter to three. There was not the customary keen competition for seats, but a dozen members entered the chamber at midnight, and several earlier in the morning. Towards the afternoon the numbers increased, there being a good attendance of business commenced.

THE LORDS.

The Lords meet at 4.30, when the "Times" announced the Government will announce the amendment of the Education Bill debate, but was nothing like the competition which prevailed at the opening of Parliament in January, for between one and nine a.m. only a few members arrived. After that hour arrivals were more frequent, and members flocked to the chamber in large numbers as the hour for the commencement of business approached.

KNOCKED DOWN BY THE KING'S MOTOR.

The King promptly stopped the car and sent a messenger to ascertain the man's injuries. The man was taken to hospital. The King resumed his journey. The injured man is John Robinson, labourer, in the railway street, Stratford, aged 52. His injuries are slight. His right arm is slightly dislocated, and the patient is suffering from slight shock.
