RE-ASSEMBLING OF PARLIAMENT.

BY TELEGRAPH TO-DAY.

Parliament re-assembled this afternoon for Autumn Session, the Commons meeting after two hours.

There was not the customary keen competition for seats, but a dozen members entered at once at midnight, and several earlier in the morning. Towards the afternoon the numbers increased, there being a good attendance of business commenced.

THE LORDS.

The Lords meet at 4.30, when, the "Times" says, the Government will announce the commencement of the Education Bill debate, but there was nothing like the competition which was witnessed at the opening of Parliament yesterday, for between one and nine a.m. only four members arrived. After that hour arrivals became more frequent, and members flocked to minister in large numbers as the hour for commencement of business approached.


