On The G.S. & W. Railway.

Yesterday afternoon the passengers by the
3.15 train from Dublin to Limerick had a novel,
and to some an alarming experience.
On arrival of the train at Kildare it was reported
that one of the saloon carriages attached to the
train was on fire, and it was found to be due to
overheating of the axle. The mischief was
apparently remedied and the train ran on to
Ballybrophy, where the axle was found to have
again "fired." The matter was again remedied,
but on arrival at Nenagh the carriage was
uncoupled and left there, the passengers having
to change into other compartments. The
incident, which presented no element of danger
was the topic of much conversation.

DEATH OF MR. JOSEPH WATSON.

We announce with very sincere regret the
death of an old and highly respected citizen,
Mr. Joseph Watson, which took place last night
at his residence, Ennis road, in the 76th year of
his age. For the very long span of forty-five
years Mr. Watson had filled the important
position of superintendent of the city water-
works, first under the old company, and for
many years past under the Corporation on their

seven years ago Mr. Watson became afflicted
with paralysis, and practically speaking, has
since been confined to his house. He bore his
trying illness with Christian fortitude, and has
passed away deeply regretted by all who knew
and respected him for his unswerving rectitude

funeral will leave at 9.30 on Thursday morning
