#### DAY BY DAY.

#### HOUSE OF LORDS.

In the House of Lords on Tuesday night the debate on the second reading of the Army Bill was commenced.

#### HOUSE OF COMMONS.

Mr. Asquith informed Mr. Pike Pease that it was not intended to guarantee a loan for the Orange River Colony.

The Prime Minister informed Mr. Balfour that the Board of Trade and the Home Office votes would be taken on Thursday next.

Captain Craig brought in a Bill to provide for the heating of National schoolhouses in Ireland.

Mr. Cleland brought in a Bill to provide and facilitate arbitration in trade disputes.

#### Civil Servants and Public Companies

Mr. MacNeill drew the attention of the Vice-President of the Department of Agriculture in Ireland to an advertisement of the Norwich Union Insurance Company in which the name of Viscount Ikerrin figured as a director of the Dublin Board, and asked whether Viscount Ikerrin holds office as an inspector of the Department in England at a salary of £600 per annum, and whether it was right that a Civil Servant should hold a directorship in a public company.

Mr. Cherry, who answered the question, said the facts were substantially as stated. He had communicated with Viscount Ikerrin, who had now ceased to be a director of the company.

#### CITY SCHOOL ATTENDANCE COMMITTEE.

The first meeting of the newly appointed committee, who are to hold office for three years, from the 1st May, 1907, was held yesterday evening. The Mayor (Councillor Kerr) presided, and there were also present—Very Rev. Dean Shanahan, P.P., V.G.; Very Rev. Andrew Murphy, Adm.; Rev. Denis Shanahan, P.P.; Brother Nolan, Rev. J. Lee, Adm.; Councillor J. G. O'Brien, with Mr. W. M. Nolan, Secretary and Messrs O'Halloran and Fitzgerald, School Attendance Officers.

On the motion of Rev. D. Shanahan, seconded by Rev. Brother Nolan the Mayor was appointed Chairman, and on the motion of the Mayor, seconded unanimously Very Rev. Dean Shanahan was appointed Vice-Chairman of the Committee.

It was decided that the meetings of the Committee be held fortnightly for the present—viz., on alternate Thursdays, at 11.30 o'clock, in the Mayor's Office, Town Hall.
