ROAD METALLING IN THE COUNTY.

Important Report by the County Surveyor.

Mr. John Horan, County Surveyor, has submitted a report to the County Council in which he states that in view of the Council's proposal to apply for a loan of £15,000 in connection with a scheme for the improvement of the roads, he had for some time past been studying the possibility of procuring at a moderate cost strong and hard stone for road repairs likely to last at least the period of the loan, viz., five years. They would be pleased to know that such stone does exist and could be procured at a moderate cost for the repairs of at least the six trunk roads for a radius of some 6 or 8 miles from the City Boundary.
