"A SLANGING MATCH."

Appeals Dismissed.

At Clare Assizes yesterday, before Mr. Justice Johnson, Mr. Timothy Flanagan, Co.C. (Chairman of the Corofin District Council), appealed against a decision of Acting County Court Judge Todd, at the January Quarter Sessions, pronouncing a verdict for the defendant, William Hogan, in an action in which Mr. Flanagan claimed £500 damages for slander alleged to have been uttered at the annual meeting of the Corofin District Council for the election of chairman. His lordship affirmed the dismissal. No costs of appeal were allowed.

In a second action by Mr. Flanagan, against Mr. James Lee, D.C., Corofin, which was also dismissed by Mr. Todd, K.C., his lordship also affirmed the decision of the lower court, characterising the occurrence as a "slanging match."

CONSTABLE'S APPEAL.

At the Clare Assizes yesterday, before Mr. Justice Johnson, William Riordan and Pat Gilhooley, constables in the R.I.C., stationed in West Clare, appealed against the decision of the County Court Judge at the Ennis January Sessions, awarding £7 damages against Riordan and £12 against Gilhooley, in an action in which Peter Daffy, farmer, Carhulegain, claimed £50 damages for assault.

His Lordship reversed the decision against Riordan, and affirmed the decree against Gilhooley, with £2 5s. expenses.
