"A SLANGING MATCH."

Appeals Dismissed.

(FROM OUR CORRESPONDENT.)

At Clare Assizes vesterday, before Mr. Justice Johnson, Mr. Timothy Flanagan, Co.C. (Chairman of the Corofin District Eduncil), appealed against a decision of Acting County Court Judge Todd, at the January Quarter Sessions, pronouncing a verdict for the defendant, William Hogan, in an action in which Mr. Flanagan claimed £500 damages for slander alleged to have been uttered at the annual meeting of the Corofin District Council for the election of chairman. His lordship affirmed the dismiss. No costs of appeal were allowed.

In a second action by Mr. Flanagan, against Mr. James Lee, D.C., Corofin, which was also dismissed by Mr. Todd, K.C., his lordship also affirmed the decision of the lower court, characterising the occurrence as a "slanging match."
